On Saturday, April 7th, the task of planting of 7,000 seedlings - 6,000 hardwood trees and 1,000 pines will begin in the common area. As a part of Project Concern, 30 - 40 I.S.U. students will hand plant as many trees as possible on that Saturday free of charge. The remainder of the trees not planted that day will be planted the following week by a contracted machine planter of which the state will share the cost of planting. Common areas to be planted with these seedlings are the areas cleaned up last fall near the water tower and before the bridge. I.S.U. faculty will assist that day but a few residents may need to oversee the operation.
