Subdivision Update

BOARD APPROVAL

The Indian Creek Board of Directors has approved Steven Sieraski's (6 Eastwood Court) request to route 30-40 truck loads of dirt across the common property in order to fill in a low spot in his backyard.

The contractor was concerned that the weight of the dirt would damage Steve's driveway. In his letter to the Board, Steve has agreed to repair any ruts and re-seed after the work is completed.

Several 2-3 foot Hawthorne trees will be removed in the 10-12 foot wide path. A 15 foot tall poplar tree will also be removed but this tree is in close proximity to a nicer oak tree and removing it will benefit the oak's future growth. This work will take place in May-June depending on the weather.

WORK DAY SUMMARY

During the May 5th subdivision work day, the old street signs were removed, the fire hydrants were painted, a tree was removed from the creek, and additional gravel was spread around the fire department's pipe to pump water from the creek and tractor park. 



STEVE LIEBENOW MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Towanda Lions Club is sponsoring a \$500.00 scholarship for a 2001 High School college bound senior and/or currently enrolled college student attending classes full time from the Towanda area. This is a one-time scholarship not open to renewal.

Applicants for this scholarship must meet the following criteria:

- 1) The applicant must have a Towanda mailing/residence address.
- 2) Average grade of C verified by a high school transcript.
- In 250 words or less, submit a letter of application containing a brief biographical profile which includes your college plans, school activities, community service activities and work history. Indicate your plans for using the scholarship money and why you are deserving of the award.
- 4) Submit 2 letters of recommendation: one from a teacher, counselor or administrator, and one from a non-relative in the Towanda area.
- 5) Submit a copy of your fall 2001 class schedule of the college/university you will be attending.
- 6) Letter of application, recommendations, transcript, and class schedule must be received by the Scholarship Committee Chairman by September 15, 2001. Mail

This scholarship is offered in memory of Steve Liebenow, a long-time Lions Club member, educator, and community leader who passed away in 1999. (See accompanying story.)

Jon Stephen Liebenow was a longtime Unit 5 principal who planned to retire at the end of the school year when he died from complications from lung surgery on Friday, March 5, 1999 at the young age of 55.

He was principal at Towanda from 1979-1987. Then he was principal of Hudson Elementary School. He went to Fairview in 1989. He was a member of the Mid-State Reading Council, a volunteer at district's annual literary contests, a volunteer at the McLean County Health Care Clinic, a member of the Towanda Lions Club and the Elementary Principals Association, a guidance counselor and coach at Villa Grove in 1965, he taught in Galesburg and began his principal duties in Stanford at the elementary school from 1975-79.

"Steve" was born June 6, 1943 in Watseka. He married Kay Norris Rapp on March 19, 1994. Kay still resides in Indian Creek Subdivision.

Steve left behind two sons, James Stephen of Colorado and Richard David of Kansas; one stepson, John Norris Rapp, two sisters, his mother, his father-in-law, mother-in-law, three nieces and one nephew.

The Towanda Lions Club is doing a wonderful thing by dedicating and providing a scholarship in Steve's name. Steve would have enjoyed that, I am sure....
