Now all three original members of the team that bought, designed and built our community have passed. Jerry Gummere, the financial brains, died this past March and Paul Ball, the real estate developer, died in 2008.

Steve Liebenow Memorial Scholarship

The Towanda Lions Club is sponsoring a \$500.00 scholarship for a 2011 High School college bound senior and/or currently enrolled college student attending classes full time from the Towanda area. This is a one-time scholarship not open to renewal.

Applicants for this scholarship must meet the following criteria:

- 1. The applicant must have a Towanda mailing residence address.
- 2. Average grade of C verified by a high school transcript.
- 3. In 250 words or less, submit a letter of application containing a brief biographical profile which includes your college plans, school activities, community service activities and work history. Indicate your plans for using the scholarship money and why you are deserving of the award.
- 4. Submit 2 letters of recommendation: one from a teacher, counselor or administrator, and one from a non-relative in the Towanda area.
- 5. Submit a copy of your fall 2011 class schedule of the college/university you will be attending.
- 6. Letter of application, recommendations, transcript, and class schedule must be received by the Scholarship Committee Chairman by September 15, 2011.
