When we have had water issues, it is sometimes a challenge to notify everyone in a timely manner. Logistically, the easiest way for us to reach out to you is electronically. But I realize that there is no substitute for a phone call. I would like each household to supply the following and send to: indiancreeknews@hotmail.com:

Current email address (even if you think we have it, please confirm by providing it again)
Best telephone number at which we can reach you or leave a message
ALL cell phone numbers for all residents of your home, even those used by children or teens AND the cellular carrier who supplies the service for each

Logistically, it is simple to build a mailing list that includes all the Indian Creek homeowners, but it is just as easy to send this information to a cell phone as a text message. That is why we are requesting not only the cell numbers for all residents of your home but the carrier as well. Each cellular carrier has a format that when sent via email, will reach the phone as a text message. I know that there are some limitations in terms of length, but we can easily send messages like "Power failure at tower. Conserve water" or "Boil order in effect for Indian Creek" or "Boil order lifted for Indian Creek". Similarly, we could also use this method to notify the neighborhood, in an emergency of "Rabid dog seen on Eastwood Ct; beware".

I realize that not everyone is as enthusiastic or familiar with this sort of technology as I am but I hope that you will give it a try by providing the information being requested. It is in your best interest to provide a means for us to reach you in the event that we have news that we must distribute quickly.
